We are so excited for you to join us at Wychwood Barns for The Disability Holiday Market! Below is some helpful information about the Market to help prepare you for your visit.


## Arriving

This is the Christie Street or West Side entrance to The Disability Holiday Market. This is the main entrance to the market; however, if you find yourself on the East Side of the building, feel free to use that entrance as well! You will enter through the door on the left.



#### The Market

When you enter the market, you will be greeted by a volunteer who will be happy to answer any of your questions or help you find whatever you may seek. To your right will be an information table where you can learn about The Disability Collective and the market.



There will be folks exploring the market, holiday music playing, and the smell of hot drinks and holiday treats in the air. Here is a list of things to expect:

## Vendors

Vendors will be at their tables selling all sorts of wonderful things. These tables will be set up in three long rows extending to the east side of the barns and will begin right when you enter. There is an ATM on site and some vendors will also accept debit and credit.





# Card Making Station

Between the entrance to the washrooms and the cozy corner on the South East side of the barns will be a Card Making Station for you and your friends and family to create some festive cards for the holidays to treasure or to send to those in need.

## Photo Booth

On the North East end of the market, located right before our raffle tables, will be a free festive Photo Booth for you and your friends and family to make memories!





## Live Musicians

On the east side of the Market, or the opposite side to the main entrance, Live Musicians will be playing from 12 PM - 5 PM.

## Raffle Tables

On the East Side of the Market, right beside the photo booth, will be tables filled with incredible raffle prizes. Raffle Tickets can be purchased at this table by cash or card.





# Community Vendors

On the East Side of the Market, right beside the raffle tables, will be community vendors selling hot beverages and snacks for you to enjoy!

# Cozy Corner

On the east side of the Market, or the opposite side to the main entrance, there will be a Cozy Corner set up with some places for you to have a seat, have a beverage & snack, and enjoy the atmosphere!

#### **ACCESS FOR THE NEURODIVERSE COMMUNITY**


For the neurodiverse community and for anyone else who could benefit, we are excited to offer:

- A sensory hour from 11 AM 12 PM where traffic, lighting, and sound in the space will be limited
- A quiet space to take a break from the market stocked with fidget toys, earplugs, weighted lap pads, and more
- An access kit at the info table stocked with fidget toys, earplugs, magnifying sheets, a whiteboard and markers, copies of the access and venue guides, and more



#### Quiet Area

If you need a break from the hustle and bustle of the Market, we will have a dedicated Quiet Area with fidget toys, ear plugs, weighted lap pads, and more, located in Suite 153 on the North Side of the Barns. There will be a sign on the door that says "Quiet Area."



#### Volunteers

Volunteers, staff, sighted guides and interpreters will be roaming the market and at the information table to the right of the main entrance. They will be more than happy to assist you, or answer any questions that you may have, and will be wearing a lanyard that looks like this:
